

4-H Poster Contest Rules

Traditional 4-H Poster

- I. Posters MUST be 14x22 inches, or half the size of a full sheet of poster board.
- 2. Make your poster HORIZONTALLY, not vertically.



- 3. Your theme MUST relate to 4-H! Do not use famous or copyright characters or people, such as Mickey Mouse or Sponge Bob.
- 4. You may use crayons, markers, paint or even the computer to design your poster.
- 5. Make sure nothing sticks up more than $1/8^{\circ}$ (same thickness as a quarter).
- 6. Be creative, neat and colorful.
- 7. On the BACK of your poster, be sure to put your first and last name, school, teacher and grade!



<u>Digital 4-H Poster</u>

- I. Your poster MUST relate to 4-H. Do not use copyright characters or people.
- 2. Your poster MUST be submitted in a PDF or PNG format.
- 3. Your poster must be clear (not blurry, grainy or pixeled).
- 4. Digital posters must also be in the horizontal format, known as "landscape."
- 5. Digital posters are not photographs of a regular poster, but rather a computer graphic design created on the computer.
- 6. Examples of programs used for designing a digital poster include: PowerPoint,
 Publisher, Illustrator or Canva.

Purple ribbon posters advance to the county 4-H Poster Contest. County winning posters advance to the State Contest. The first place COUNTY poster will be the design for our summer 4-H Camp T-shirt.

Agent will pick posters up from all schools on **December 15th**! Please be sure 4-H'ers have their poster completed and turned in BEFORE December 15th.
